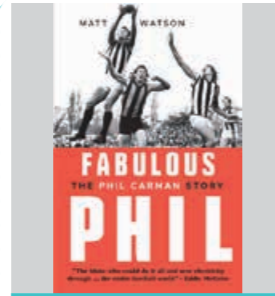
Encourage a love of reading amongst children and young people during the summer holidays and join today.

DOWNLOAD YOUR FREE eBOOKS & eAUDIOBOOKS



Free eBooks and eAudiobooks are available through Kingston Libraries. Perfect for summer holiday road trips or for reading and listening by the beach or pool, simply download the Bolinda BorrowBox or Axis360 apps to your tablet or smartphone and register using your library card number, PIN, and your email address. Contact the library on 1300 135 668 if you are unsure of your PIN.

How to install BorrowBox

1. Download the BorrowBox app and open.
2. You will be taken to a registration page where you enter :

- which library you are connecting to: **Kingston Library**
- your library card number and PIN, then tap 'sign in'
- accept Bolinda Digital's Terms and Conditions
- complete registration by entering your email address and tap 'done'
- this will take you to the BorrowBox Tips, which you can skip, then your BorrowBox account!

How to install Axis360

1. Download the Axis360 app and open
2. At the bottom of the screen skip the introduction pages
3. On the registration page enter:

- which library you are connecting to: **Kingston Information and Library Service**
- your library card number and PIN then tap 'login'
- complete your details for 'create patron account' and tap 'register'
- this will take you to your Axis360 account!

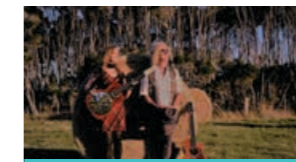
