
Raingarden refurbishment works on Alleyne Ave, Bonbeach

We're writing to advise that we will be commencing refurbishment works in the coming weeks on the water treatment raingardens at Alleyne Ave, Bonbeach.

The refurbishment works include the manual removal of existing rock layers, vegetation and weed management. Following these works, reprofiling of the garden basin and installation of new native plantings will occur (see overleaf for examples).

What are raingardens?

Raingardens capture, filter, and treat stormwater before it enters our waterways. They feature a vegetated area that removes pollutants from stormwater runoff by trapping litter, leaves, and sediment from the road, filtering the stormwater through plants and loamy sandy layers. The clean water is then collected through pipes and directed back into the traditional drainage system ending at the bay.

Project timeline and impacts

The refurbishment works will commence in July and take approximately four weeks to complete, weather permitting. Traffic management will be in place to direct vehicles and pedestrians; however, there may be minor traffic delays and impacted parking bays throughout the works. We apologise for any inconvenience and will minimise disruption wherever possible.

Once the works are complete, our Open Space Team will continue regular cyclic maintenance to ensure these assets thrive and function as intended.
