Upcoming construction works for Iluka Reserve off-lead dog area

Following community consultation undertaken last year, works will soon commence at the dog off-leash park at Iluka Reserve, Aspendale.

The works include:

- Installing a fence on the southern side of the pathway in Iluka Reserve to separate the off-lead dog area from other park users (please see map overleaf)
- Installation of new turf
- Minor landscaping works
- Relocating the football and soccer goals.

Relocating the football and soccer goals

As part of the works Council will be relocating the football and soccer goals outside of the fenced off-lead area for the safety of the community. Please see map overleaf for the proposed location.

Timing

Works are expected to commence in late September and will take approximately 8 weeks (subject to COVID-19 restrictions). The reserve will remain open for community use during works, however some areas may be restricted. The fenced dog off-lead area will be unavailable for use for 6 weeks following the completion of works to allow the grass to establish – all other areas of the reserve will remain open during this time.

Whilst the dog-off lead area is being upgraded we encourage you to visit nearby parks with off-leash areas including Glen Street Reserve, Aspendale and Nurten Parade Reserve, Aspendale Gardens.
