Council provides free immunisation sessions within Kingston for children aged 6 weeks to 4 years old. Council also conducts school immunisation sessions at all our local secondary schools.

Your Maternal & Child Health Nurse will discuss immunisation and inform you of our community sessions. You're welcome to attend any session, no appointment required.

All council immunisation sessions follow the National Immunisation Program (NIP) which is free. If you require immunisation outside of the NIP please contact us prior to attending. Credit card and EFTPOS is available at some venues for fee-based vaccines

What do I need to bring?

- Your Medicare card
- Your child's health record book
- Any previous vaccine history
