Notice of upcoming construction works for Moorabbin Reserve Pocket Park

As part of Council's ongoing investment in the Moorabbin Reserve precinct, construction works are set to begin this month on a new pocket park.

The works will transform a corner of the site, located next to the Moorabbin Bowls Club at the intersection of South Road and Linton Street, and create an attractive entry into the broader Moorabbin Reserve.

The works are the last major component of the Moorabbin Reserve Master Plan, which has also seen Council renew Junior and Senior play spaces; install pathways and lighting, plus upgrade the Moorabbin Bowls Club Carpark.

Pocket park

The new park will improve accessibility and act as a gateway into Moorabbin Reserve from South Road. It will offer open, green space for rest and relaxation for the local community and include seating and trees to provide shade.

A new path through the site will form a connection from South Road to the existing path network in the reserve. Native vegetation will frame the park and provide habitat for birds, insects and butterflies. Please see the concept plans overleaf for more information.

Construction is set to commence in late-March and is expected to be finished by mid-late 2021.

Construction impacts

Temporary fencing and signage will be installed during works. Access to some parts of Moorabbin Reserve will be temporarily restricted for the safety of the community.
