## Station Street – Traffic Safety Measures – Lawrence Avenue to Lincoln Parade

Council has been made aware of several casualty crashes on Station Street between Lawrence Avenue and Lincoln Parade. Many of these crashes involve motorists turning into the angled parking spaces outside the shops, and cyclists in the southbound cycle lane adjacent to the parking bays.

To help reduce the number of crashes, Council is proposing to install the following traffic measures (please see plan overleaf).

- A green surface within the bicycle lane.
- Two electronic 'watch for cyclists' signs (activated by a bicycle detector loop) on the eastern side of Station Street to increase the awareness of cyclists using the cycle lane.
- A 500mm wide line-marked 'buffer zone' between the bicycle lane and the traffic lane.
- 'Rumble strip' line-markings within the 'buffer zone'.
- 'Keep Clear' markings at the intersection of Station Street with Lawrence Avenue.

The proposed traffic treatment will also require the traffic lanes on Station Street to be narrowed slightly to accommodate the installation of the 'buffer zone', and the relocation the existing 'railway ahead' signs.

These measures will increase awareness of cyclists and reduce the likelihood of crashes involving motorists turning into a parking space.

Council is seeking Federal Blackspot Program funding for this project in 2020-2021.

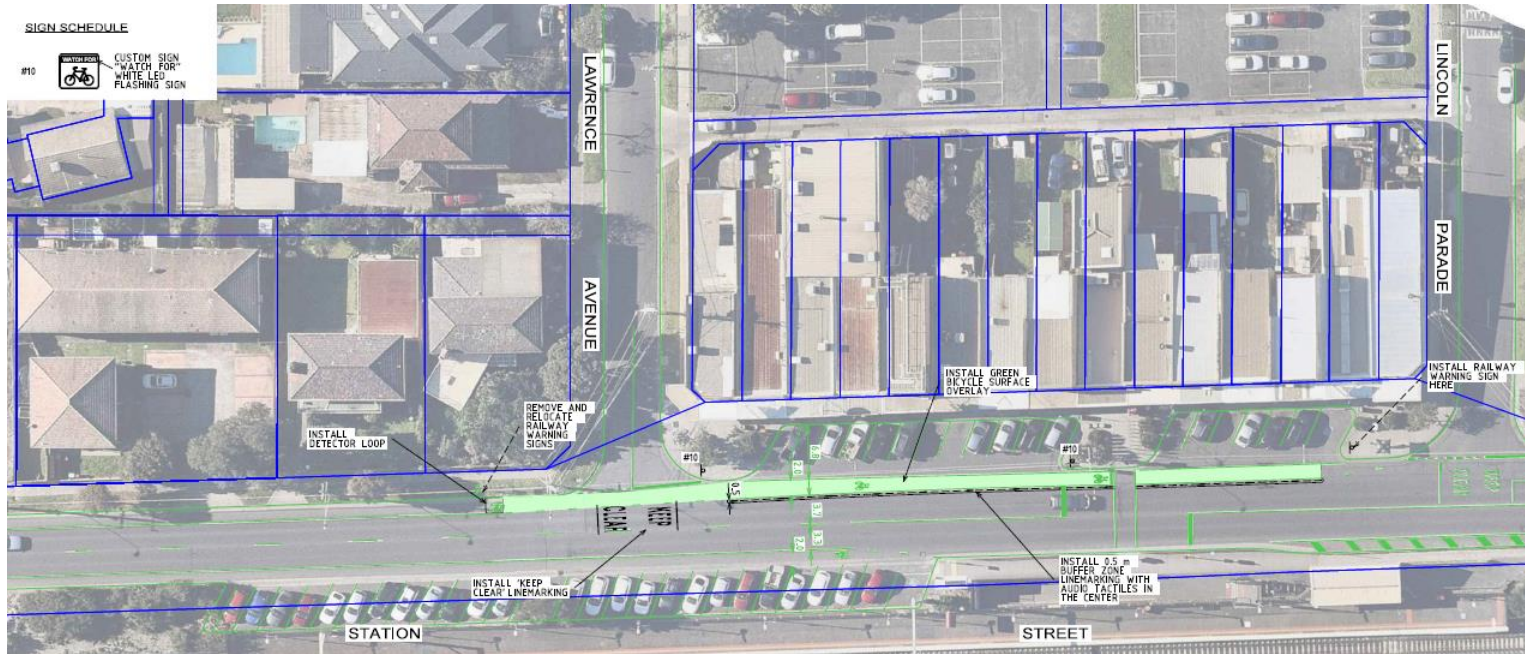
