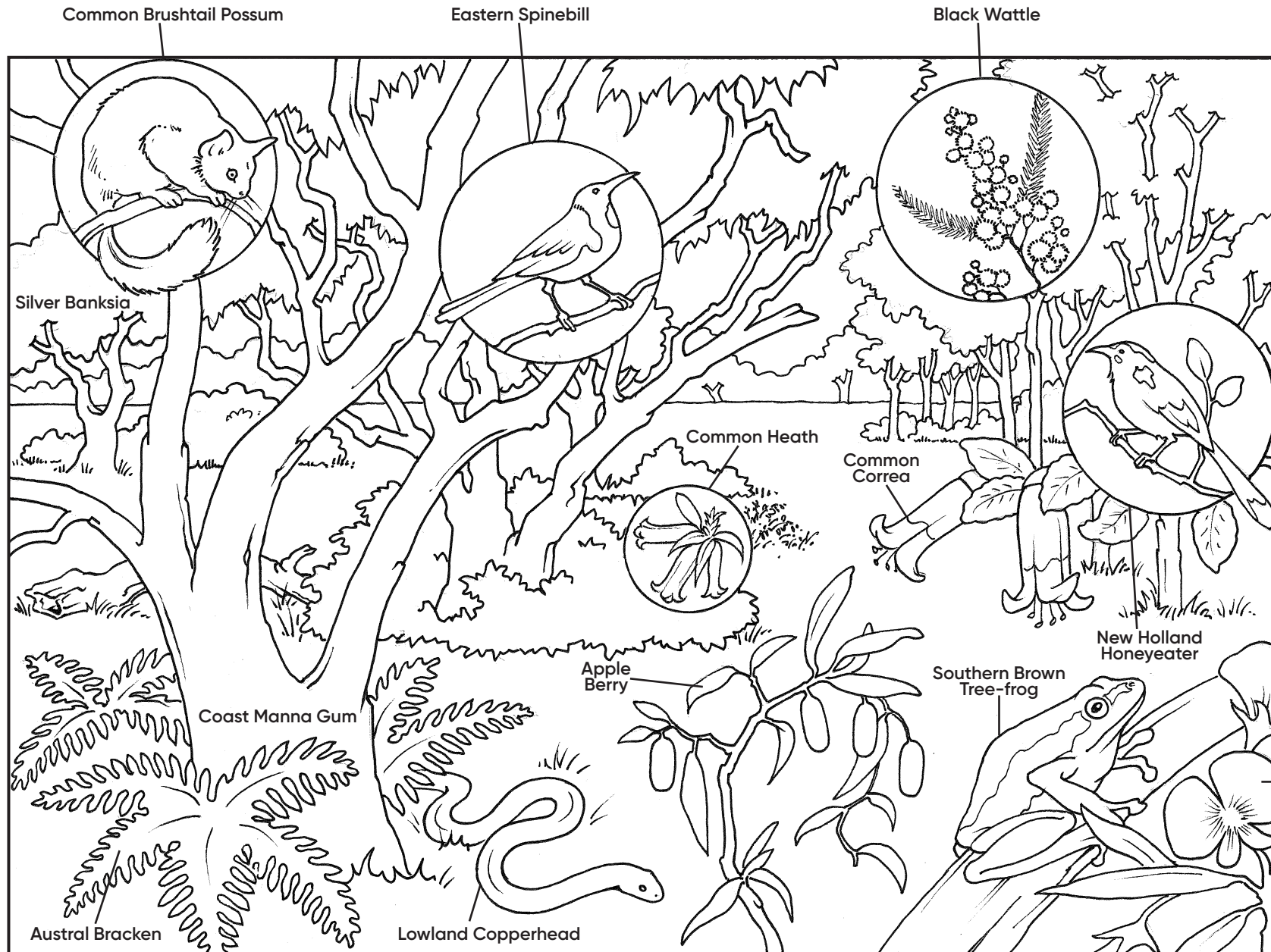

Tips

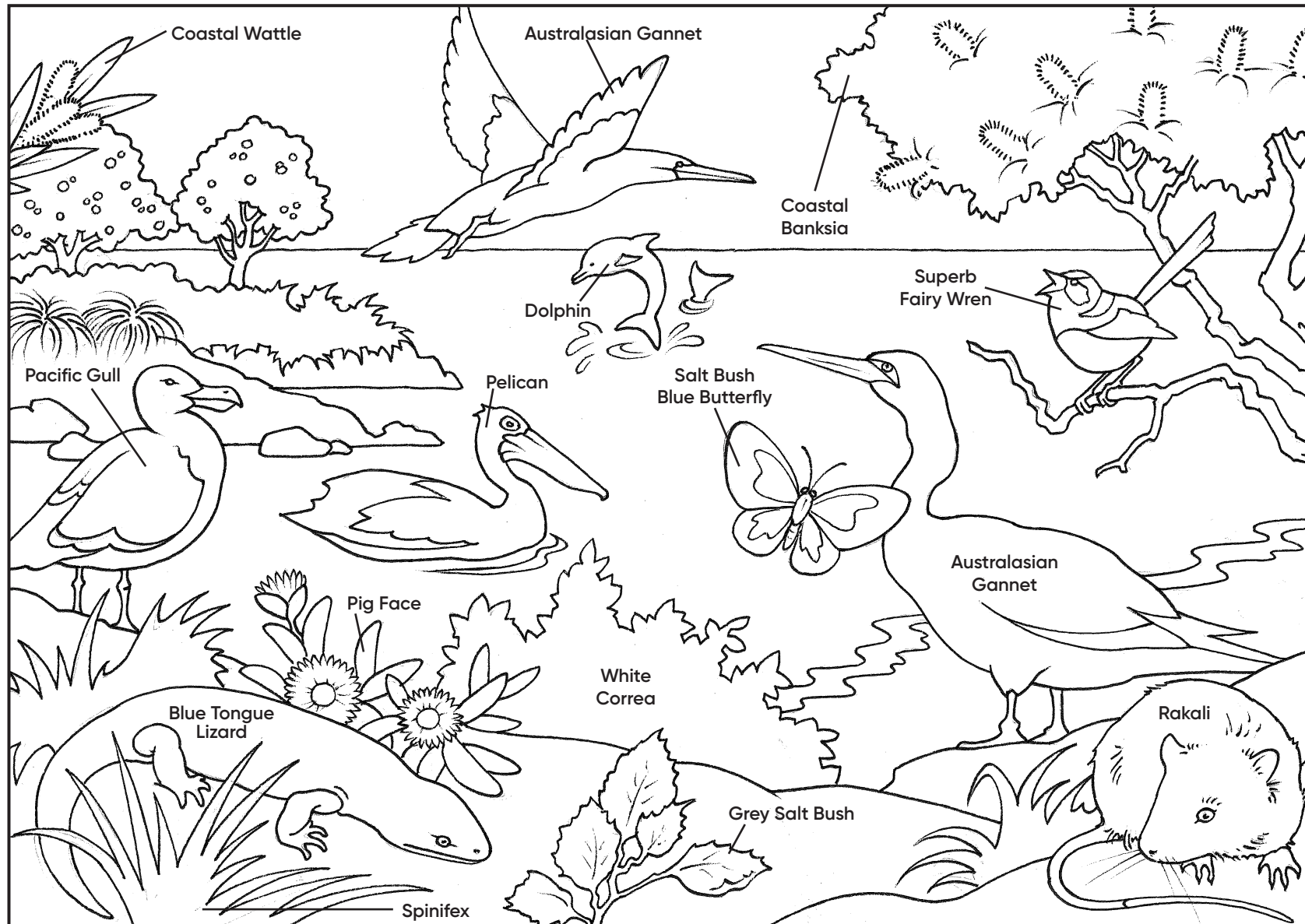
- Protect our precious plants – walk on the path to avoid stepping on plants.

When at the beach

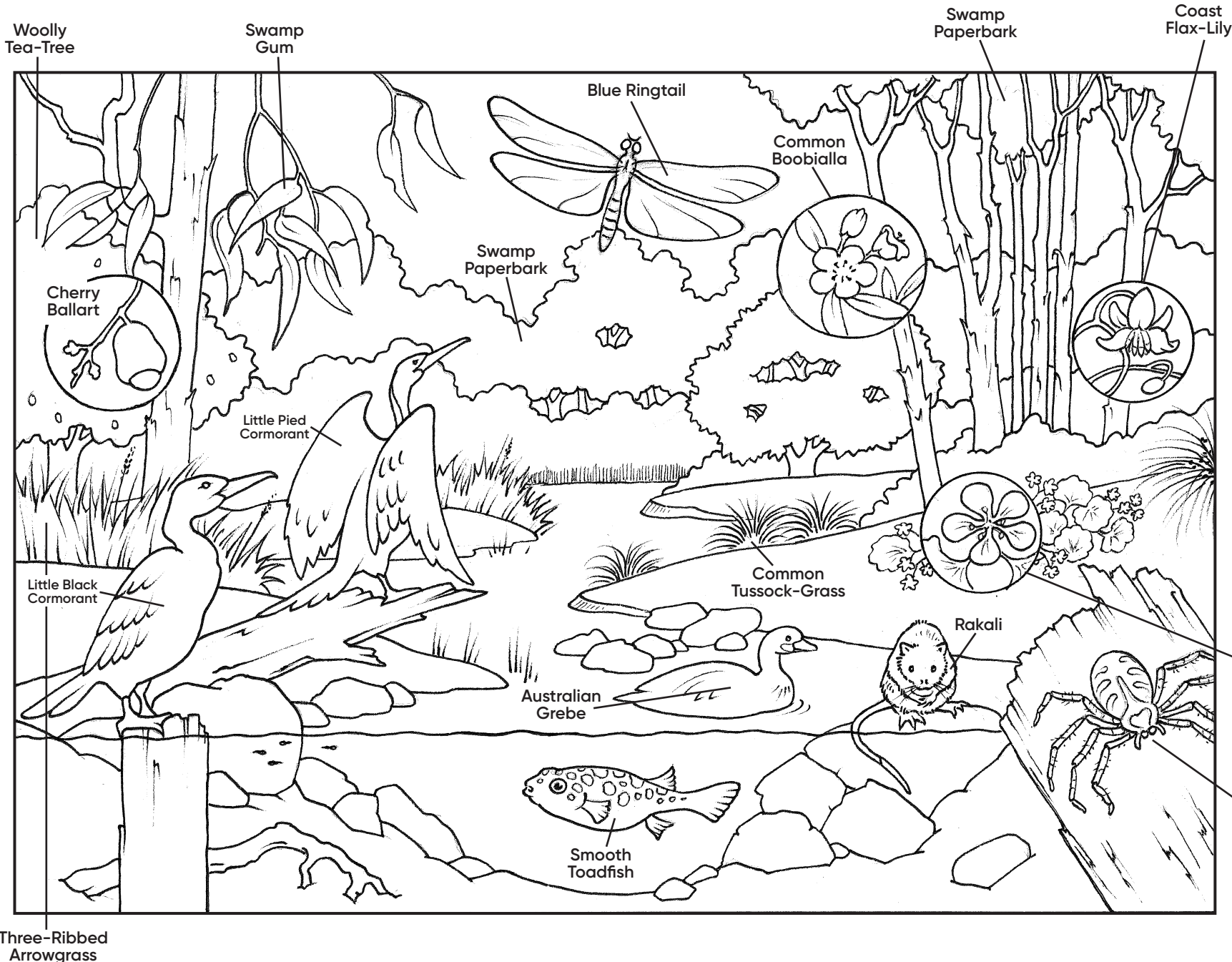


Tips

Tips

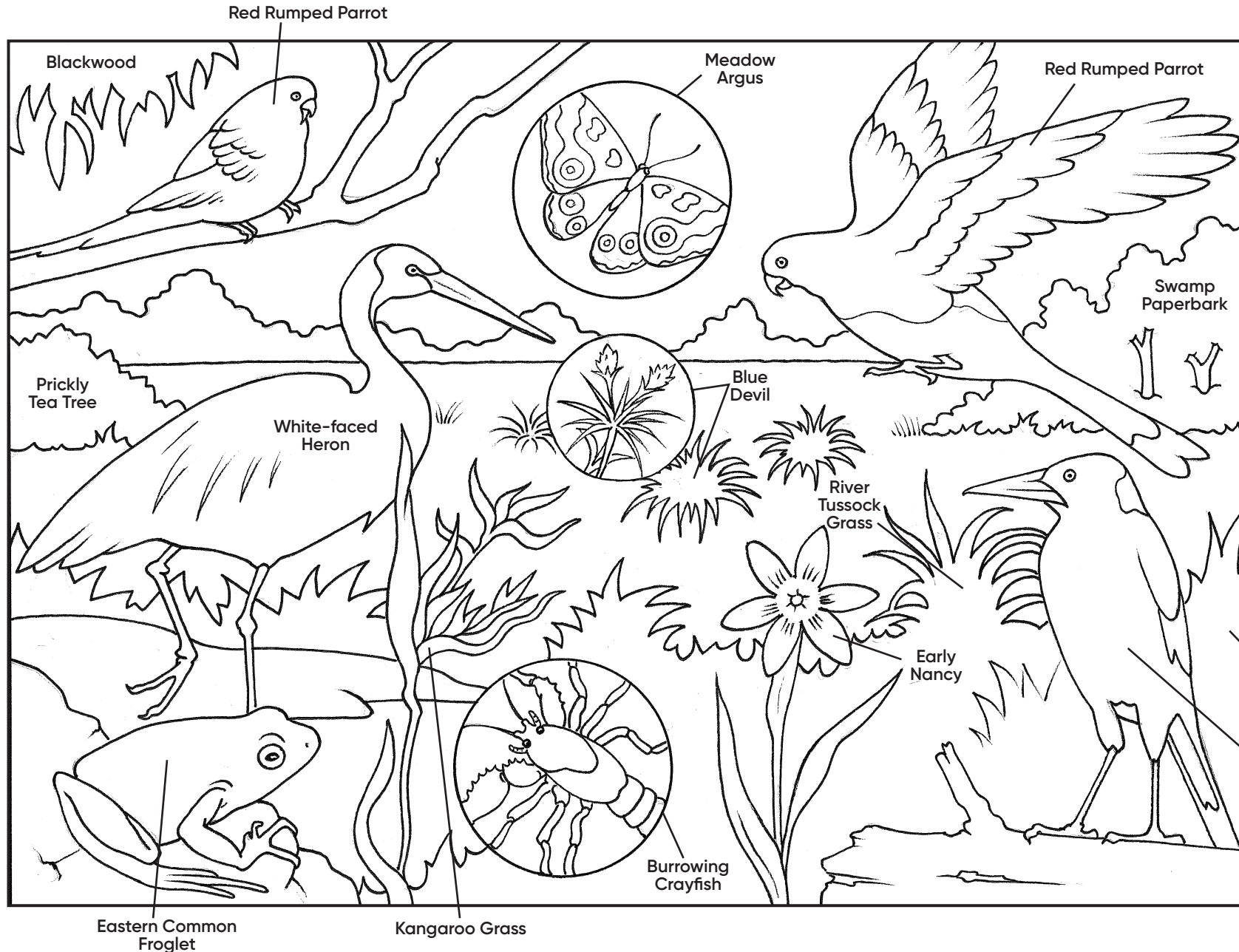

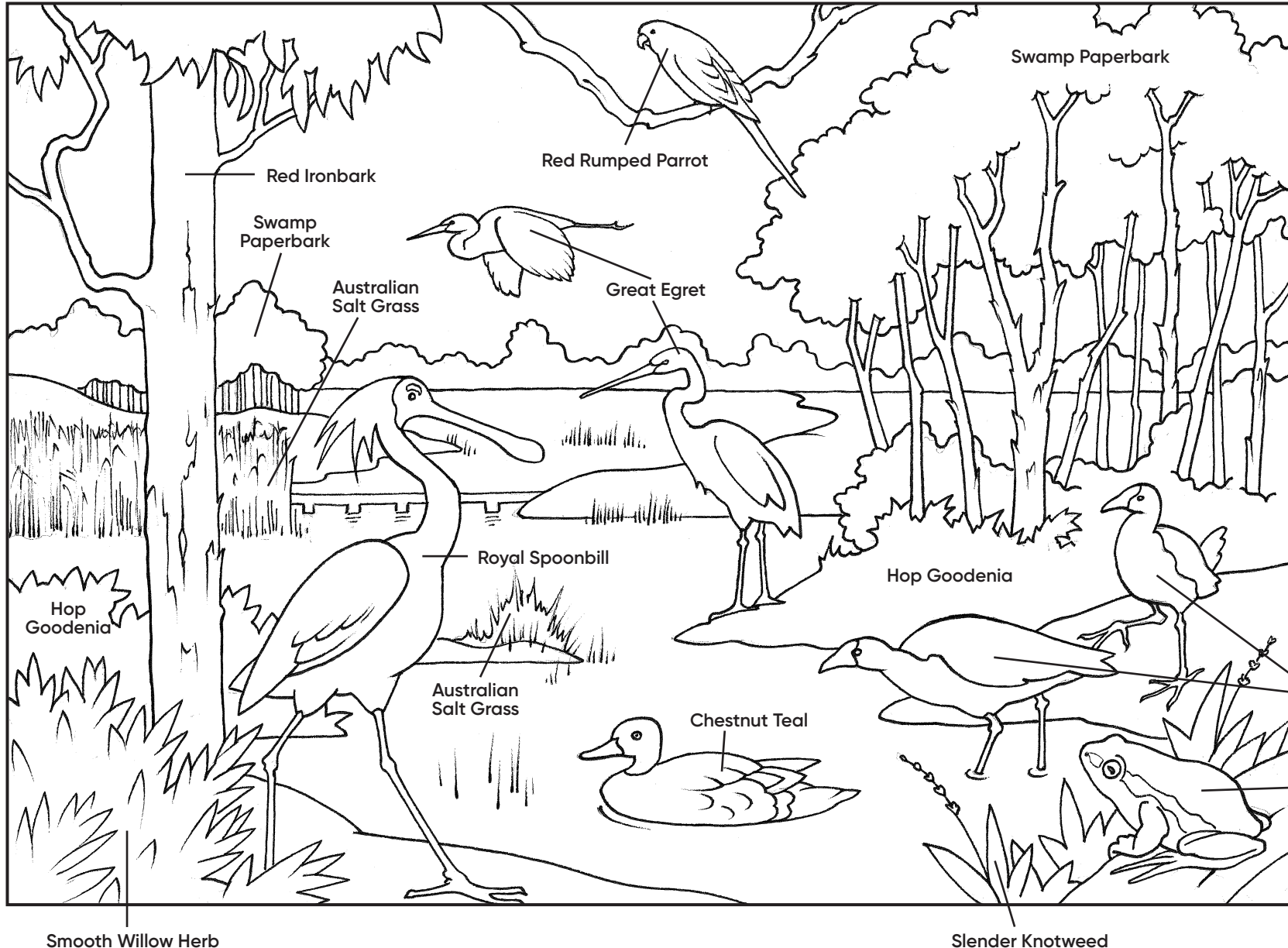

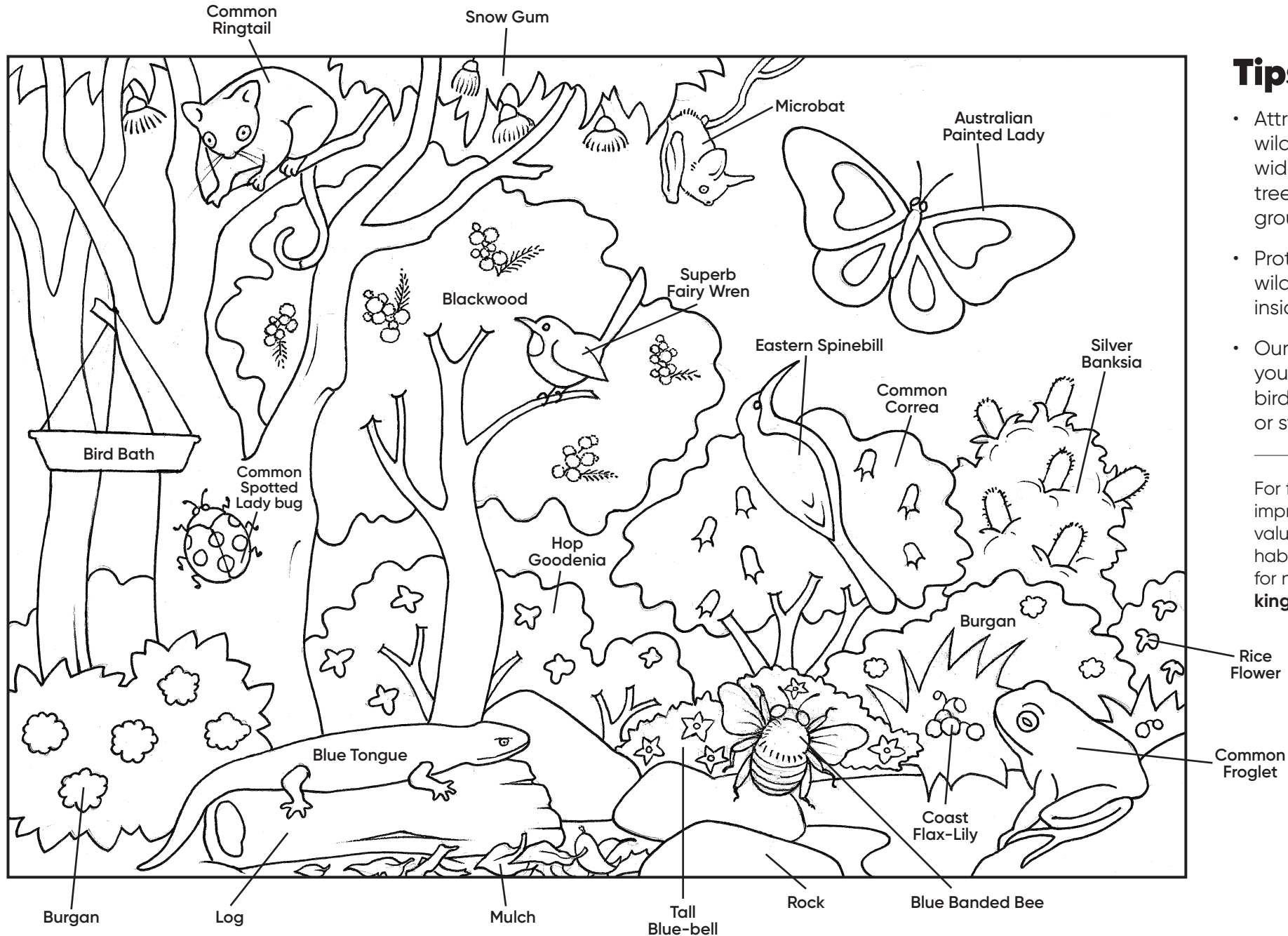


Australian Swamp Hen
