

## WALKABLE CATCHMENTS – 10 MINUTE WALK

Council's service level for walkable access to a play space is up to 10-minutes walk from home to a play space for every resident. In 2023, 97% of our residential population can walk ten minutes (approximately 800m) to a play space.

In Clarinda, 95% of the population has access to play within a 10-minute walk from home. This is shown below:

The application of the general planning provision of one playground per 1,400 residents demonstrates that across 2021 to 2036 (population forecast) there is surplus of playgrounds in Clarinda – refer table below.

## **ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES**



### Issues and opportunities

- » Population projections suggest that demand for playgrounds won't increase over the next 20 years. Current provision levels are adequate to service existing population however, expected Suburban Rail Loop (SRL) population increase (at Clayton) will have an impact on provision of play demand. Council could consider advocacy to SRL project regarding adequate provision for these activities via the project and/or compensatory measures.
- » 95% of the current population in Clarinda is within a 10-minute walk of a play space.
- » There is limited opportunities in Clarinda for teen activities; there is only one active recreation facility (disc golf), and existing playgrounds don't cater well for teens. However, the endorsed master plan for Namatjira Park (in neighbouring Clayton South) will provide increased play and active recreation offerings for surrounding communities (including Clarinda).

- » By comparison to other Kingston suburbs, vehicle ownership is low and so is income; appropriate provision for play at no cost and close to home is critical to ensure equitable access is available to residents in Clarinda. Equitable access to services and facilities is a key objective of Council's 2021–2025 Public Health and Wellbeing Plan and should be applied to play spaces also.
- » Over 50% of residents in Clarinda were born overseas so consideration regarding cultural influences on physical activity pursuits and play interests should be considered in play space design and supporting amenities.
- » There may be opportunities in Clarinda to consider use of former landfill sites, Chain of Parks and green wedge locations for further provision of play options as the population increases (SRL based forecast growth).

## **Strategic Intentions**

- » Uplift Dalbeattie Reserve to a Suburb level play space to create opportunities for a broader range of young people and older adults to be physically active in Clarinda.
- » Assess existing play spaces at end of life, to determine need to alter play space classification or relocate play provision to better located sites which enables provision of higher quality play options.
- » Diversify play space classifications, to facilitate inclusion of active recreation options for young people living in Clarinda as well as social family recreation options at Local play spaces including cultural gatherings, celebrations and small events.
